# HEALTH AND SAFETY GUIDELINES 2022 EUROPE VOYAGES

## PRIOR TO TRAVEL

Ensure that you understand requirements for traveling from your home country to the destinations you plan to visit (including air travel policies)

### Please complete the following prior to boarding:

- All guests ages five and above will require a medically observed, negative viral COVID-19 test (PCR or antigen) result taken within 3-days of embarkation (for Greece embarkations the requirement is 2-day antigen or 3-day PCR COVID-19 test).
- Proof of full vaccination, including booster if eligible. For these cruises the definition of “fully vaccinated” is at least 14 days and no more than 270 days (9 months) since the last dose in the vaccine series of an approved COVID-19 vaccine. A single booster dose is required for guests 18 years of age and older whose final dose of an approved/authorized COVID-19 vaccine is older than 9 months (270 days) to be considered “fully vaccinated.”
- Guests under 5 years of age do not need to be vaccinated. Children between the ages of 5-11 who are not vaccinated may request an exemption at the time of booking and if approved may be subject to additional testing and protocols. Guests who are eligible for, but have not received a booster may request an exemption at the time of booking and if approved may be subject to additional testing, fees and protocols. Exceptions are limited and not guaranteed.

## CHECK IN ONLINE OR VIA SEABOURN SOURCE APP

- Download Seabourn Source App
- Complete your Online Guest Registration at Seabourn.com as soon as you have booked
- Complete and accept risk acknowledgment, vaccination attestation form and cruise contract
- Complete health questionnaire 72-24 hours before embarkation
- Get boarding pass and check-in time

## EMBARKATION

### Required ID and Documentation

Bring your required ID and show completion of your health questionnaire and risk acknowledgement.

### Proof of COVID-19 Vaccination

The following are acceptable proofs of full vaccination:

- Original COVID-19 vaccination card
- Digital COVID-19 certificate, including NHS COVID pass and EU DCC (QR code acceptable); or record of COVID-19 vaccination from a healthcare provider including original digital email notification, personal electronic health record, or government Immunization Information System (IIS) record
- Documents are required to include vaccine type, the date of each vaccine administered, the individuals name and date of birth or other identifier

### Proof of Negative COVID-19 Test Result

Bring negative, medically observed COVID-19 test result taken within 3-days of embarkation. For guests embarking in Greece, bring your antigen test result taken with 2-days or PCR within 3-days of embarkation.



## ONBOARD

Masks are recommended on board but not required. We highly recommend guests wear a mask in specific venues and during other congregate events.



## SHORE EXCURSIONS

Fully vaccinated guests can explore destinations on their own or on independent third-party tours. The ability for guests to go ashore in ports of call is controlled by the governments of the ports we visit. Please be aware that as destination conditions change, you may be required to take a Seabourn shore excursion to go ashore.



## POST-CRUISE DEPARTURE TEST

If a negative antigen COVID-19 test is required for re-entry into your home country, Seabourn will cover the costs of a COVID-19 test which will be conducted on board prior to disembarkation upon proof of same-day travel. Guests who book a post-cruise stay before traveling home should ensure they meet all testing requirements. If the test provided on board does not meet the requirements for onward travel, additional testing is the responsibility of the guest.
